

USDA Plant Hardiness Zone Map, Ann Lif



The USDA Plant Hardiness Zone Map is the standard by which gardeners and growers can determine which perennial plants are most likely to thrive at a location. https://planthardiness.ars.usda.gov/home

Most of Nebraska remains in a 5 zone, with its most southern regions moving into a zone 6. USDA was able to pull information from 13,412 weather stations; the last map in 2012 used information from 7,983 stations. https://cropwatch.unl.edu/2023/usda-hardiness-zone-sees-few-changes-most-nebraska
